CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF HAMPTON  
EMPLOYMENT SECURITY ORDINANCE

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF HAMPTON ORDAINS:

WHEREAS, the Charter Township of Hampton of the County of Bay, State of Michigan, organized and existing under the laws of the State of Michigan, is authorized by Act No. 9 of the Public Acts of the Extra Session of 1956, being MCLA §421.19a, to elect to become subject to the provisions of the Michigan Employment Security Act in order to provide its employees with unemployment compensation coverage.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF HAMPTON ORDAINS:

Section 1. Short Title.

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the "Charter Township of Hampton Employment Security Ordinance."

Section 2. Election of Coverage.

The Charter Township of Hampton hereby elects, in accordance with the provisions of Section 25 (1) of the Michigan Employment Security Act, being MCLA §421.25 (1), that all services performed by individuals in its various departments with the exception of elected and appointed officials, shall constitute employment within the meaning of the Michigan Employment Security Act.

Section 3. Period of Coverage and Termination.

This election shall be effective for at least two calendar years and may be terminated thereafter as of the end of the calendar quarter in which written notice is received by the Michigan Employment Security Commission.

Section 4. Effective Date of Liability.

This election shall become effective as of the first day of the calendar quarter in which the Michigan Employment Security Commission receives the application for election.

Section 5. Reports and Notices.

The Charter Township of Hampton, through its various departments and establishments, shall furnish to its employees and to the Michigan Employment Security Commission all reports, information and notices required of employers by the Michigan Employment Security Act and Commission rules and regulations.

Section 6. Payments to Michigan Employment Security Commission.

As required by Section 19a of the Michigan Employment Security Act, being MCLA §421.19a, the Charter Township of Hampton shall pay to the Michigan Employment Security Commission an amount equivalent to the amount of benefits paid and charged to its Rating Account, and the Treasurer of the Charter Township of Hampton is hereby required and authorized to make such payments at such times and in such manner as the Michigan Employment Security Commission may prescribe.

Section 7. Penalty.

Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$100.00 or imprisonment in the County Jail not to exceed 90 days or both, such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

Section 8. Separability.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 9. Ordinances Repealed.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 10. Emergency Ordinance Declaration

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance.

Section 11. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon publication thereof.
